All exhibits, horticulture or otherwise, must have been grown by or be unaided work of the exhibitors.

Exhibitors can only enter 1 item per class.

Entry forms, fees and exhibits to be entered on the day between 11.00am and 12.30pm.

Fees are 50p per entry in main classes.

Children's classes are free.

Exhibitors may remove exhibits between 3.45pm and 4.00pm.

The judges' decision is final.
